POSITION DESCRIPTION

Brooklyn Children's Museum seeks an experienced videographer and video editor to create introductory videos, instructional videos, collections object B-roll, and still photography for an ongoing curriculum project. This scope of work will support the development of virtual content to enable the expansion of virtual learning opportunities and access to the Museum's collection. In this project based, temporary position, you will partner closely with the collections department to produce short-form videos for the Museum's website, social media platforms and other key digital channels.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Produce, shoot, and edit videos for the Museum, including capturing and editing new footage and all sound mixing (approximately 24 one- to two-minute collection object "close-up" videos, six one- to two-minute theme introductory videos, and one one- to three-minute program overview video).
- Manage, catalogue, and archive all final assets and footage
- Collaborate with collections department in the generation of content, outlining scripts, and directing presenters

PREFERRED PROFESSIONAL BACKGROUND & APTITUDES:

- Prior filming experience and portfolio required
- Core video production skills, including camera, lighting, sound, and grip
- Knowledge of file formats, codecs, and proper handling in post-production workflow
- Must have your own equipment and software
- Great communication and storytelling skills
- Effectively interprets needs and develops creative/technical solutions
- Ability to work collaboratively and independently
- Warmth, positive energy, and a sincere love of working on a project in service of youth and their families
- Position requires ability to manage physical aspects of shoots, including carrying and setting up equipment as needed
