



Ice Cube Painting

Stay fresh, cool, and creative! Freeze water and food coloring to make ice cubes to paint with on hot, summer days.

Materials

- · Food coloring or water-based paint
- · Ice cube trays
- Popsicle sticks, toothpicks, chopsticks or plastic cutlery
- · Paper
- · Small towel



Instructions

- 1. Pour water into the ice cube trays.
- Drop 10 or more drops of food coloring or water-based paint into each ice-cube section. Try mixing two primary colors—red, yellow, blue—to create secondary colors!
- 3. Stir the colorful water in each ice cube section.
- 4. Place one popsicle stick or a similar item in each ice cube section.
- Move the ice cube tray into the freezer carefully and wait at least five hours for the ice to set.
- 6. Pop the ice cube paints out of the tray, and enjoy some cool and colorful art-making!

Go Further

Now try moving color through ice!
Fill a carton with water, seal it up, and place it in the freezer. Cut the carton off of the frozen ice cube on a baking tray.
Sprinkle kosher or sea salt on top of the cube. Add drops of food coloring onto the salt. Watch the salt create colorful crevasses in your ice sculpture.
