Celebrate Women's History Month at Brooklyn Children's Museum this March

(Brooklyn, NY)— Brooklyn Children's Museum is offering two programs this March to engage young visitors in a celebration of Women's History Month.

For the occasion of **International Women's Day on Saturday, March 8 from 2:00 pm – 4:00 pm**, teaching artists from [Haiti Cultural Exchange](#) will lead a coronation craft project through which children will make their own *kouwòn papyè* (paper crowns), adorning them with original drawings and *flè* (flowers) to honor a special woman in their life or community.

The activity is offered through BCM's [Ti Atis](#) ("Little Artists") program, which takes place the second Saturday of each month. Participation in *Ti Atis* is available to all with Museum admission.

On **Thursday, March 20 at 3:00 pm**, visitors to BCM can enjoy a [HERstory performance](#) with Spanish/English bilingual singer and musician [Flor Bromley](#). *HERstory* is Flor's musical, one woman show about the influential women of today.

Attendance at *HERstory*, and entrance to BCM on March 20 between 2:00 pm – 5:00 pm, is free through [Community Access Thursdays](#), made possible by the support of Amazon and the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs in partnership with the City Council.
