## **Chelsey Joi Jackson Elected to Board of Brooklyn Children's Museum**

**Brooklyn, NY** — [Brooklyn Children's Museum \(BCM\)](#), the world's first children's museum, announces that Chelsey Joi Jackson has joined its Board of Trustees.

Jackson is a Brooklyn resident and Client Lead at Google, where she advises clients on growth strategy, partnerships, and business innovation. Across her career, she has managed more than

\$100 million in business portfolios, built multi-million-dollar partnerships, and supported initiatives focused on equity, mentorship, and long-term community advancement.

Raised in Detroit, Jackson traces her commitment to children’s learning back to early experiences with science, creativity, and discovery. Programs like the Detroit Area Pre-College Engineering Program (DAPCEP), visits to science museums, libraries, and academic competitions such as Science Olympiad helped shape her understanding of what is possible for young people.

“Children’s museums are places of firsts,” said **Chelsey Joi Jackson**. “They are the first spark, the first moment a child realizes their ideas actually belong in the world, and that their current circumstances do not define their ultimate ceiling. I am the direct product of the curiosity these spaces ignite. Winning first place in the egg drop competition for Science Olympiad was my own first definitive ‘aha’ moment, proving to me that creative problem-solving could yield tangible results. Programs like the Detroit Area Pre-College Engineering Program (DAPCEP) showed me a universe I didn’t know existed, and science permanently changed the trajectory of my life. I see this role as a responsibility to help ensure the next generation encounters those same breakthrough moments.”

“Chelsey is an exceptional addition to the board, and her vision and expertise will enrich our museum and the communities we serve,” **Board Co-Chair Amanda Sue Nichols** said. “She joins a board of directors who are as dedicated as they are talented and pour their hearts into this institution. We are thrilled to have her with us.”

“We are proud to welcome Chelsey to the board,” **Board Co-Chair Michael Frazier** said. “Her passion for curiosity, creativity, problem-solving, and learning speaks directly to our mission, and her contributions will benefit the board, our staff, and every visitor we have the privilege of welcoming to the world’s first children museum.”

At Google, Jackson has also served in advisory, education, and mentorship capacities, including supporting the growth of the Black+ Googler Network Leadership Board and leading onboarding and education strategy for cohorts of more than 100 incoming Googlers. As a Trustee, Jackson will support BCM’s work as a leading cultural and educational resource for families in Brooklyn and beyond.
